**SUPPLEMENTAL
DECLARATION OF
PLAINTIFF JANN
DeMARS**

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I, Jann DeMars, make this supplemental declaration pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1746 based on my personal knowledge:

1. I am a United States citizen, a resident of Genesee County, Michigan, a federal taxpayer, a member of the Thomas More Law Center, and a Catholic.

2. I do not have private health care insurance, nor do I want to be compelled by the federal government to purchase health care coverage. I have two children living with me. One has basic health care coverage through her employer, the other does not.

3. My employer does not provide health care coverage for me or any of my children. Pursuant to the "Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act" (hereinafter "Act"), my W-2 for 2011 will report to the federal government that I do not have health care coverage.

4. To purchase basic health care coverage for me would cost \$8,832.00 per year, and to add one child it would increase to \$9,914.28 per year. These figures are based on quotes I received from Blue Cross & Blue Shield of Michigan. My children and I are healthy, and I have never incurred a medical cost even close to these amounts.

5. I am a responsible, law-abiding citizen. I would comply with the Act rather than pay a penalty, even if the penalty is less of an economic burden. Consequently, I feel compelled to comply with our Nation's laws, particularly since Congress considers it a "shared responsibility" of all Americans to have health care coverage and those who do not are considered freeloaders. Therefore, there is an official social stigma that the Act imposes on those Americans, including me, who do not have health care coverage.

6. As a Catholic, I am morally compelled to abide by all laws that are just and not contrary to the moral law. Consequently, because the penalty that I would pay for not


purchasing private health insurance would be paid to the federal government and could be used to fund abortions through the Act, the penalty provision is immoral and unjust, further compelling me to purchase private health insurance to avoid contributing to abortion in any way.

7. I am presently making significant financial sacrifices to ensure that I am able to purchase health care coverage as required by the Act. For example, because of the Act I have to cut back on my food budget. I have to cut back on discretionary spending, such as costs associated with entertainment, like going to the movies, and costs associated with purchasing gifts for family and friends. I have to forego making home and car repairs or purchasing items for my home. In sum, to find an additional \$700 a month in my already tight budget is very difficult, if not impossible. Consequently, I may have to consider finding a new job or taking on a second job or even moving so as to lower my rent/mortgage payments to meet the requirements of the Act.

8. The Act is presently causing me a great deal of stress. It is forcing me now to make financial decisions that I should not have to make, and consequently forcing me to change the way I live. I am presently being forced by the Act into a Hobson's choice: either maintain my modest standard of living or make drastic changes to allow me to comply with the Act and my conscience.

I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the United States and the State of Michigan that the foregoing is true and correct.
